Plant News announces signing of the credit union charter for GE-MSJ Federal Credit Union (General Electric - Motor San Jose), started by 14 plant workers. Credit Unions are **not-for-profit financial cooperatives** historically begun by employees.

1964 1ST EMPLOYEE HIRED

First employee hired: Kay Becker. Today, 70% of the U.S credit union workforce is female, **including 51% as CEOs**, nearly 14 times higher than the percentage of female CEOs at banks.¹

EXCITE'S MOBILE BRANCH CONTRIBUTES TO WILMINGTON RESIDENT'S SUCCESS

Because Excite's mobile branch visited the Wilmington Housing Authority in North Carolina, Quanesha was able to open her first savings account in 2021. Only two years later, she started her own business.

Excite's mobile branch brings the benefits of Membership to low and moderate-income communities in the Wilmington area, serving people who may have difficulty visiting a regular branch.

With the help of the Excite team, Quanesha took steps to achieve her financial goals. "We reviewed her credit, and I offered tips and next steps to help improve it," said Joaquin Rivas, Excite Business Development Officer. "With the proper tools and information, everyone can take control of their finances and build a strong credit history."

Quanesha appreciated the service and support. "The Excite Credit Union staff is top tier," she said. "The staff is always friendly and very knowledgeable. They take their time explaining the process from start to finish."

A year after joining, she received her first unsecured personal loan. In 2023, she opened a business account with Excite when she started her own business, which empowers youth in her community.

She is grateful for the ways that Excite works to improve the lives of families in her area. "Not only are they empowering the parents but the next generation as well," she said. "The financial literacy classes that they offer in the community are making systemic changes. Excite Union Credit is bringing financial literacy to our front door."



EXCITE ENABLES PARTNERS TO LAUNCH A WORKERS' COOPERATIVE

With Excite's assistance, Cynthia and her Latina business partners opened the accounts they needed to launch their workers' cooperative, Cocinando con Amor.

When the women first dreamed of starting a catering and food delivery service in San Jose, California, some of them faced challenges to employment. However, they all shared a belief that language and other difficulties should not be barriers to growth.



Getting started wasn't easy. Cynthia described the process as "tocando las puertas" [knocking on the doors] as they visited several different banks that imposed numerous requirements to opening a business account. However, Cocinando con Amor [Cooking with Love] was able to establish business checking and savings accounts with Excite.

"Excite fue quien nos brindó atención y apoyo," [Excite was the one who gave us attention and support], said Cynthia, a mother of three, who has lived in San Jose for over 15 years.

In addition to receiving assistance from Excite, Cynthia and her partners benefitted from the training and guidance of other nonprofit organizations, including Jobs to Grow, Veggielution, and the Latino Business Foundation. They learned to connect with resources, develop business plans, obtain permits, file taxes, use social media for marketing, and much more. They registered their business with Santa Clara County in 2022.

That same year, Excite and the Latino Business Foundation Silicon Valley joined the nonprofit SOMOS Mayfair as the ground-floor tenants at Quetzal Gardens, an affordable housing complex in East San Jose. Their partnership intends to bring economic mobility and justice to residents and the surrounding neighborhoods.

This collaborative effort also aims to enhance education and opportunities around cooperatives—such as Cocinando con Amor—as a sustainable alternative to traditional employment for excluded workers.

EXCITE'S FINANCIAL COACHING IMPACTS A MISSION COLLEGE STUDENT'S FUTURE

With financial coaching, Excite helped Christina, a Mission College student, prepare herself and her children for a bright future.

In 2022, Jerry Uribe, Excite Business Development Manager, was offering drop-in financial coaching at Mission College in Santa Clara, California, when he met Christina, who serves as student director of activities. Christina recognized a fellow extrovert in Jerry and felt comfortable talking with him. "I enjoy connecting myself and others to resources, and I had several questions about personal finances," she said.

Christina had enrolled in college after dropping out of high school, earning her GED at age 21, and deciding to improve her educational and employment opportunities.

As a result of Jerry's coaching, Christina was able to raise her credit score, increase her savings, and now looks forward to opening savings accounts for her two toddlers. "I'm thankful for getting involved with Excite ... and for the information I needed," she said.

Through its Community Business Partner agreement with Mission College, Excite provides financial literacy coaching, such as Christina received. In addition, Excite enables Mission College to provide two scholarships each year, gives faculty access to financial planning tools, and participates in special school events. An Excite ATM is conveniently located inside the Student Services Building.

After receiving assistance from Excite, Christina is paying it forward. Passionate about math and the environment, she gives back to her community by tutoring high school students through the nonprofit Elevate Tutoring.

In a unique partnership with the State Treasurer's Office, Excite began promoting the California Kids Investment and Development Savings Program to increase awareness and registration among eligible families.

"Our campaign to educate the East San Jose community about the CalKIDS program has resulted in registration rates that are 31% higher than other areas of Santa Clara County. Further, the growth in registrations since August 2023 has been 111% higher in East San Jose than in the rest of the county."
